

UNITED METHODIST LEADERSHIP SCHOLARS PROGRAM (UMLS)

The UMLS program is sponsored by the Southeastern Jurisdiction of the United Methodist Church and administered by the United Methodist Higher Education Foundation.

Through the UMLS program, local churches are encouraged to provide \$1,000 scholarships on behalf of students planning to enroll in one of the participating United Methodist-related colleges or universities located in the Southeastern Jurisdiction. These institutions have agreed to match local church funds for a total award of \$2,000.

UMLS is a point-of-entry scholarship only. Applicants must be first-time enrollees in a United Methodist-related higher education institution (any class status) to be eligible for a UMLS award.

Apply online at www.umhef.org. Online applications are accepted from January 1 through March 15 each year at. A church check for exactly \$1,000 must also be submitted to UMHEF to complete the application.

FOUNDATION MERIT SCHOLARS

For each United Methodist-related preparatory or undergraduate school in the U.S., UMHEF annually allocates a \$1,000 scholarship each for a freshman, sophomore, junior, and senior (4-year colleges and college preparatory schools) and for a freshman and sophomore (2-year colleges).

For each United Methodist-related seminary or professional school in the U.S., UMHEF annu-

ally allocates a \$3,000 scholarship each for a first, second, and final-year student.

Recipients must be nominated by their school. Please check with your school's Financial Aid Office for further information.

OTHER FUNDS

The **Hoover-Lee Scholarship** provides scholarship grants to students from Southeast Asia — who are not citizens or residents of the United States — to attend a United Methodist-related institution in the United States.

The **September 11 Memorial Scholarship** provides assistance for surviving victims and dependents of victims of the September 11 terrorist attacks.

The **Chaplain Powell Scholarship** provides scholarship assistance to students preparing for chaplaincy in any branch of the military.

The **Dempster Graduate Fellowship** assists worthy Ph.D. students who are committed to serving the church through theological education.

The **Georgia Harkness Scholarship** supports women over 35 to prepare for ordained ministry as an elder in The United Methodist Church as a second career.

SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMS





A NATIONAL FOUNDATION ESTABLISHED in 1965 and based in Nashville, Tennessee, the United Methodist Higher Education Foundation (UMHEF) provides scholarship aid for United Methodist students attending United Methodist-related schools, colleges, universities, and seminaries in the United States.

Our Grand Vision is that it be economically possible for any qualified United Methodist student to be educated at a United Methodist-related institution of higher education.

UMHEF receives no apportionment support from The United Methodist Church.

SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMS

All awards are made for the fall term each year. Renewals of awards are not automatic. Application must be made each year. Students may receive only one scholarship award per year from the United Methodist Higher Education Foundation.

UNITED METHODIST DOLLARS FOR SCHOLARS (UMDFS)

UMHEF can **Double Your Dollars** by providing a \$1,000 matching scholarship for United Methodist students when a local church raises \$1,000 to assist them in attending a United Methodist-related college, university or seminary in the U.S.

Three-quarters of the United Methodist institutions of higher education in the U.S. have agreed to participate in the **Triple Your Dollars** portion of the program by providing an addi-

tional \$1,000 directly to their students for a total award of \$3,000 to scholarship recipients. Please check with your school for details about their match.

Under the **Quadruple Your Dollars** portion of the program, several UM conference foundations have agreed to provide an additional \$1,000 match for recipients from their conferences for a total award of \$4,000 to these students. These foundations reserve the right to limit the number of available matches.

Apply online at www.umhef.org. Online applications are accepted from January 1 through March 1 each year. A church check for exactly \$1,000 must also be submitted to UMHEF to complete the application.

The number of awards available through this program is determined annually. Recipients are chosen randomly. Church checks of un-awarded applicants will be returned.

NAMED ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP FUNDS

UMHEF has a number of named endowed scholarship funds that have been established by private donors. Some of these funds stipulate that the applicant meet specific criteria. Applicants to the General Named Endowed Funds program will be considered for all scholarships for which they are qualified. Minimum award is \$1,000.
